**National Mission: Strong and inclusive schools committed to excellence, equity and well-being**

£12,004 from the Education Improvement Grant was combined with the PDG and PDG Early years grant to employ a teacher to target pupils' literacy skills across the school.

£84,629 was used to hire staff to work towards the Foundation Phase ratios.

**EFFECT:**

As a result of excellent ratios in the Foundation Phase, the children make excellent progress in their skills, taking into account their starting places.

£4,409 of the Education Improvement Grant (EIG) was used to develop an engaging curriculum for our learners.

**IMPACT ON PROVISION:**

Teachers were able to plan engaging opportunities for our children such as the Streic Fawr Musical at Neuadd Ogwen or the fantastic Gwald y Rwala show at Ysgol Cae top by collaborating to develop a creative curriculum and deepen their understanding of the Curriculum for Wales.

**IMPACT ON STANDARDS:**

Creative approaches have had a huge impact on pupils' confidence and attitude towards Cymraeg. This is a big step in the right direction towards developing fully bi-lingual and multi-lingual pupils.

### National Mission:

Ensuring the well-being of learners as a foundation for learning

£7,600 of the Pupil Development Grant was used to train two teachers to intervene at the diploma level in Trauma-Informed Schools (including training and supply cover costs).

### IMPACT:

As a result of the training, students eligible for free school meals and other vulnerable students were able to access effective emotional support. Additionally, the teachers managed to disseminate the pedagogy effectively among other staff members. Consequently, behavior and attitudes towards learning are excellent across the school. The self-image and social skills of students in the target groups have significantly improved.

### National Mission:

Developing early literacy and numeracy skills

£29,200 of the Pupil Development Grant and £13,800 of the Early Years Pupil Development Grant were used to employ an additional teacher to target pupils' literacy and numeracy skills. The teacher co-taught in the Nursery class for the first hour every day before moving on to target groups of pupils throughout the school.

### IMPACT:

As a result of effective targeting, many of the targeted pupils made very good progress. Due to having two teachers in the Nursery class, most of the children made excellent progress from their starting points.
